
GED MATH

I've spent the last ten years telling students that the GED Math Test is not as difficult as they might think. For starters, the GED Math Test is organized into four basic subject areas:

Algebra Geometry Number Sense Data Analysis & Measurement

Also, most people are not aware that the test is made up of word problems, graphs, charts and picture problems. So you will not see questions like below:



Questions 1 and 2 are examples of what you will see on the GED Math Test.

- 1. James was responsible for encouraging the 165 employees at Hite Industries to carpool. By the third year, James had convinced 3/5 of the workforce to carpool. How many employees did not carpool?

GED READING TESTS

I get calls every week from students asking how to study for the Social Studies, Science or Reading Test. First, these tests are not test of what you know about history, chemistry or reading – they are testing your reading skill as it relates to Social Studies, Science or and Reading. The tests cover four primary skill areas:

Comprehension
Analysis
Evaluation
Application

The tests are made up of reading passages, graphs, charts and picture problems, political cartoons, maps, etc. So you will not see questions asking the following:


In what year did George Washington become President?

The Essay and Writing Tests are combined for one score and make up the Language Arts, Writing Test. Your Essay is graded on a scale of 1-4. You must score at least a 2 – if you don't, you will get a 0 on the entire section and fail the GED Writing Test!

The GED Writing Test covers basic English grammar through correcting sentences, revising sentences, etc.
